This certification is granted to business sites that employ personnel qualified as first-aid instructors, etc., and in which at least 30% of all employees have completed valid life-saving training.

As a company engaged in offshore wind power development, the Company regards HSE (Health, Safety, and Environment) as one of its top management priorities. The Company has actively promoted the enhancement of safety awareness among employees and the acquisition of life-saving skills. As a result of these ongoing efforts, more than 30% of all employees have now completed life-saving training, leading to this certification.

On the same day, the Marubeni Building, which houses the Company’s head office, also received an award from the Tokyo Fire Department in recognition of its ongoing disaster prevention activities. The Company has been actively participating in building-wide initiatives such as evacuation drills and AED training sessions. Together with the award of the Certificate of Excellence in Life-Saving Training, we believe this demonstrates a high level of disaster preparedness throughout the entire head office building.

Going forward, the Company will continue to promote participation in life-saving training and to conduct practical disaster prevention drills, striving to ensure that every employee maintains a high level of safety awareness. Through these efforts, we aim to create a workplace environment where everyone can work with peace of mind and contribute to the safety of the local community.
